

# THE SEED OF THE UNIVERSE

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## Chapter Two

### “The Seed”

When I first read the Translation of the KJV from cover to cover, I noticed that the people of the early times used the word “Seed” as though it was common knowledge. I had heard the word Seed used but never understood exactly what it was. I had never heard a preacher preach on it or anyone try to explain it throughout my entire life.

When I first read the Translation of the KJV, I made it a point not to miss one single word. I was very careful to mark where I started to read and where I stopped each time that I continued my reading sessions. Like most Christians, I had read a lot in the Translation prior to this but never read it from cover to cover.

When I got to the 5<sup>th</sup> chapter of Genesis, reading was a nightmare. I could not pronounce all those Hebrew names and it was not interesting at all. I thought about skipping over it but remembered my promise that I made to myself that I would read every word. Therefore, I continued to read, this chapter explained the lineage of Adam and it told of generation after generation, the name of each child, and how old he was in Adam’s life span.

Then it dawned on me that this was talking about the life of Adam and his Seed. This was a story about the Seed of Mankind. This was what I had been looking for that I was trying to understand all this time.

After I read the 5<sup>th</sup> chapter, I got a pen and paper and started to write down the ages of each child. I added them all up inside my head and got a rough number close to 930 years, the age of Adam. I noticed that when the child was conceived, the age of the parent was not mentioned. This was before the flood of Noah took place. Therefore, I started to calculate an average age and ended up with 55 years which came out to 930 years the age of Adam. I made a chart

with the ages of all the children, grandchildren, etc. so that you can see how the ages add up. Although we believe by faith, sometimes evidence can make our faith stronger. It is also good for people like Jesus disciple, Thomas, who Jesus had to show him evidence before he could believe.

Adam lived 130 years and begat Seth.  
Seth lived 55 years and begat Enos  
Enos lived 55 years and begat Mahalaleel  
Mahalaleel lived 55 years and begat Jared  
Jared lived 55 years and begat Enoc  
Enoc lived 55 years and begat Methuselah  
Methuselah lived 55 years and begat Lemach  
Lemach lived 55 years and begat Noah  
Noah lived 55 years and begat Shem  
Shem lived 100 years and begat Arphaxad  
Arphaxad lived 35 years and begat Salah  
Salah lived 40 years and begat Eber  
Eber lived 30 years and begat Peleg  
Peleg lived 34 years and begat Reu  
Reu lived 30 years and begat Serug  
Serug lived 32 years and begat Nahor  
Nahor lived 30 years and begat Terah  
Terah lived 29 years and begat Abram (Abraham)  
Add all of the ages \_\_\_\_\_  
930 years, the age of Adam  
Note ... The ages of when the parents conceived the child was not given before the flood, so, I had to use an average age of 55 years.

I had uncovered some lost knowledge that was very important in the understanding of the Bible. I later realized that this could also answer some of the mysteries about the blood of Jesus and him being the one-time sacrifice for the entire world and why his birth was such a long time coming. I told everyone that I talked to about it and they looked at me as though I had a loose screw inside my head. I realized that it was too deep for some people just to pick up on right out of the blue.

Later down the road, I read about the 7 churches in the book of Revelation and saw that it told about the characteristics of each seed and that you could

actually see those characteristics in some of the people around you. I connected those seven churches to the seven seeds that were on the Ark of Noah.

There were eight mentioned on the Ark, Noah, his wife, his three sons and their wives. Then I realized that Noah's seed went through one of his sons, so that seed was the same as one... That left 7 seeds... That's why the number 7 is used so much throughout the Bible. Seven golden candlesticks, seven spirits, seven this and seven that. For each seed, there were distinctive characteristics that connected to them. If Jesus ended up with all those seven seeds in his blood, that would be the same as your blood, my blood, his blood and her blood, all within the veins of Jesus to make up his sacrificial blood. That would mean that it was everyone's blood that was spilled on the cross for every person on earth and all that was to come.

So now the sacrifice had meaning that I could understand. The wages of sin is death and our blood would be required for our sins. But instead of us dying to pay for our sins, Jesus who had the same blood as each one of us died in our place so that we would not have to die to cover our own sins. God knew that Jesus was without sin, so he could be resurrected were we couldn't because we are all sinners. As it stands, we can get forgiveness through Jesus as our sacrifice. So, it was your blood and my blood, his blood and her blood, that was spilled on the cross that day for all mankind. That would also make Jesus like our big brother having the same blood as we have in his veins. For the blood is the life of everyone. ... The Bible says that the water, the blood, and the spirit are all three the same, and they all agree in one. The Bible tells us not to drink blood for it is the life of whatever it came out of. ... With the understanding of the seed of mankind, a whole new revelation opened up within me.

While in a doctor's office one time, I picked up a Newsweek Magazine when I noticed a woman on the cover. There was a string of the DNA molecule running down the center of her face. On her right side of her face was a new modern-day photograph while on her left side of her face was an old black and white picture with age spots here and there like it was made back in the twenties or thirties. I realized that the illustrator was saying that this same woman had lived in the past within Each person on earth has a seed of their own and they also carry the seed of an ancestor which is programed inside their DNA. It lives on from

generation to generation till it finally dies out and the family name or that seed can disappear from the earth.

In the case of Jesus Christ, the seeds lived on till Jesus was born and since he did not have a wife there was no one to carry the seed to another generation. However, Jesus was on a mission for God and lived his life in total obedience to God. Therefore, he was without sin and being sin free, death could not hold him.

God raised Jesus from the dead and give him eternal life and the power to become our mediator between God and mankind, so that we could be forgiven (if we are sincere and can forgive others). One hundred percent of Jesus's mind is in 100% agreement with the mind of God, so what mind he has is the same as God.

The understanding of God is what we call the Holy Ghost and that is also a part of God. But God's knowledge goes beyond everything and Jesus said, "Without God, he could do nothing". Some people think that Jesus is God, but Jesus says over and over throughout the New Testament that he is not God.

This is just a few scriptures, but I have page after page that I have saved that says Jesus is not God. Here are a few of the scriptures to show what I am trying to explain.

... John 12:4 ... Jesus cried and said, He that believeth on me, believeth not on me, but on him that sent me.

... John 12:49 ... For I have not spoken of myself; but the Father which sent me, he gave me a commandment, what I should say, and what I should speak.

... 1 John 4:15 ... Whosoever shall confess that Jesus is the Son of God, God dwelleth in him, and he in God.

... 1 Peter 1:3 ... Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,

... John 3:34 ... For he whom God hath sent speaketh the words of God: for God giveth not the Spirit by measure unto him.

... Matthew 19:17 ... And he said unto him, Why callest thou me good? there is none good but one, that is, God: but if thou wilt enter into life, keep the commandments.

13: ... 1 Corinthians 2:6 ... For who hath known the mind of the Lord, that he may instruct him? But we have the mind of Christ.

... Ephesians 5:2. ... And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet smelling savour.

14: ... Romans, 8:38-39 ... For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Any one of these verses should be enough to tell you that Jesus is the son of God and not God? God also tells us that he is the only God.

I have the above verses that I found myself through Bible study over the years, but the one that I like the most does not say that Jesus is not God, but logic alone confirms it.

Matthew 4:10 ... Then saith Jesus unto him, Get thee hence, Satan: for it is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve.

Matthew 4:11 ... Then the devil leaveth him, and, behold, angels came and ministered unto him.

If angels ministered to Jesus, this proves that Jesus is not God, because Angels would never dare try to minister to God. ... Think about that?

Ask yourself, how could God raise his own self from the dead? How could the Truth die? How could true Love die? How could God sit at his own right hand? The list goes on and on. Jesus become equal with God through obedience to God. In other words, the compete mind of Jesus was in 100% agreement with God, but the mind of God went far beyond that. Jesus was one of us, but God's thoughts are higher than our thoughts.

The Bible is full of knowledge, like compressed knowledge and the more you understand the stronger your faith in God will be.

I also made a chart one time that was very interesting. I recorded each seed of each generation of the blood line from Adam to Joseph and Mary. ... Yes, I did use the name Joseph ... The book of Matthew gives a list of the seed of Joseph from Abraham to Joseph. Then the Book of Luke gives the generations of Mary's seed from Adam to Joseph and Mary. Be careful when you read about Mary's seed because atheist try to twist the scriptures by saying that Heli was the father of Joseph, but Heli was the father-in-law of Joseph not his father. Joseph's blood father's name was Jacob.

The Bible does not say exactly how the conception took place. It does say the Holy Ghost was there and hovered over Mary while both Joseph and Mary slept. Neither one knew what went on, but we do know the blood line of Joseph was recorded in the book of Matthew. If God took the rib from Adam to make Eve, then would it be too hard for him to take the sperm from Joseph to implant it into Mary to make Jesus? Now the Bible does not say this, but it doesn't say anything about how it all happened. The reason is not recorded either. Could the reason be that God did not want Mary to know the lust for sex? The answer might be someplace within the Bible that I might have read over, or it might just be one of those things that if it was told about that it might lead to something that could cause a lot of trouble for the older generations before ours. God did open the mind of science for Artificial Insemination for our generation so that

we would know that it is possible. The Catholic Church calls it Immaculate Conception meaning clean and sin free. I understand this as, they did not get that from scriptures, just a way of explaining it to people without sounding vulgar. However, I understand it the same way that it came from Joseph and Mary and not from the Holy Ghost. The Holy Ghost was behind it, but we don't know how it happened. The Bible does call Jesus ... the Son of Man ... The Son of Abraham ... the Son of God ... The Son of David. ... The Lamb of God, ...If that is any help to you.

This is my understanding from the scriptures from the Bible. If I understand it right, then there was a lot about Jesus that is not understood by most people. It is a help to me to understand the sacrifice and I hope it will be a help to you as well.

The bottom line being, it happened, it worked. Jesus was sin free and is our sacrifice for all mankind. If we accept him and we can forgive other people and become born again, then we could be among the many that God will choose that will enter Heaven. God will choose his own to populate eternal heaven from the overall world population that have lived and died since the birth of mankind.
